boots, but the soles wore out more quickly than I would have liked. Like other racers, I couldn't just drop another \$400 dollars on a new set, especially when the boots were otherwise still in great shape.

One option for getting them repaired was to send them to Alpinestars directly, but I decided to try out another route. I sent mine to MX Boot Resole & Repair/Anthony's Leatherworks, located in Corona Del Mar, Calif.

Turnaround time was phenomenal. I sent them in on a Thursday and received them back the next Tuesday.

The repaired boot soles looked and felt brand new. As a bonus, the company not only repaired the boots, but they cleaned them up to look new.
